## FEBRUARY COURSE MAINTEANCE UPDATE

February is a transition month for the golf course, where winter work begins to taper and early spring preparation takes shape. Our team is balancing ongoing seasonal projects with steps that ensure the course is ready to respond quickly once growth resumes.

In January, we completed the section of irrigation mainline replacement, improving system reliability and reducing the risk of in-season disruptions. With this major work behind us, our attention has shifted to fine-tuning course conditions and completing remaining winter tasks.

Current efforts are focused on selective cleanup in wetlands and wood lines, prioritizing areas that improve playability, sightlines, and long-term turf performance. This work helps the course transition more efficiently into spring without impacting daily play.

Frost delays remain a factor during February mornings. Traffic on frosted turf can lead to injury that may not become visible until warmer weather arrives, so we appreciate everyone's cooperation in staying off playing surfaces during those periods.

We are also using this time to finalize equipment preparation and operational planning, allowing our team to move quickly and consistently as spring maintenance ramps up.

Thank you for your continued patience and support. Simple efforts such as repairing ball marks, filling divots, and respecting traffic controls play an important role in protecting course conditions as we approach the growing season.

Here is a little history of Perdido Key/Lost Key and the inspiration behind the original logo of Lost Key Golf Club:

In 1693, explorers had heard of a great mysterious body of water in-between Pensacola and Mobile, but they were unable to find the entrance. Even after locating the mouth of the bay, they were unable to find a waterway deep enough to sail through. According to legend, a ship led by cartographer, Carlos de Sigüenza y Góngora had been blown off course as he was again searching for the pass into the deep inland waters. The ship was spotted by an Indian chief camped with his tribe at Bear Point. As the chief was walking by the water, he spotted Sigüenza attempting to reef his sails. He offered to guide Sigüenza and his men to a connecting deep-water channel from the Gulf of Mexico to the more tranquil bay. When the search party finally located the elusive bay, they called it Perdido, which in Spanish means "lost" or "hidden". Since then, the unincorporated community in Escambia County, Florida, called Perdido Key has been known to many as a unique community where one comes for seclusion, and to "get lost" on the barrier island among the snow-white sand beaches and emerald waters. # RECIPE OF THE MONTH

## MEATBALLS

### Ingredients:

- ½ lb ground beef
- ½ lb ground veal
- ½ lb ground Italian sausage
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 1 tsp salt
- ¼ tsp pepper
- ¼ tsp fresh oregano
- ¼ tsp fresh basil
- ½ cup grated Parmesan
- 2 tbsp chopped fresh parsley
- 2 cloves garlic, chopped
- 2 tsp grated lemon rind
- ¼ cup breadcrumbs

### Instructions:

1. Combine all ingredients in a large bowl.
2. Mix thoroughly until well blended.
3. Cover and let the mixture rest in the refrigerator for 20–30 minutes.
4. Form into balls.
5. Bake at 350°F until browned, rotating halfway through.
6. Finish cooking the meatballs in red sauce.
